Ash Disposal Procedure

Preparation:

- Ensure the sauna stove has cooled completely before beginning the ash disposal process.
- Gather necessary equipment: heat-resistant gloves, metal ash shovel, metal ash bucket with a lid, and a brush.

Safety Gear:

- Wear heat-resistant gloves to protect your hands from residual heat and potential sharp objects within the ash.

- Use the metal ash shovel to carefully scoop out the ashes from the stove.
- Place the ashes into the metal ash bucket.
